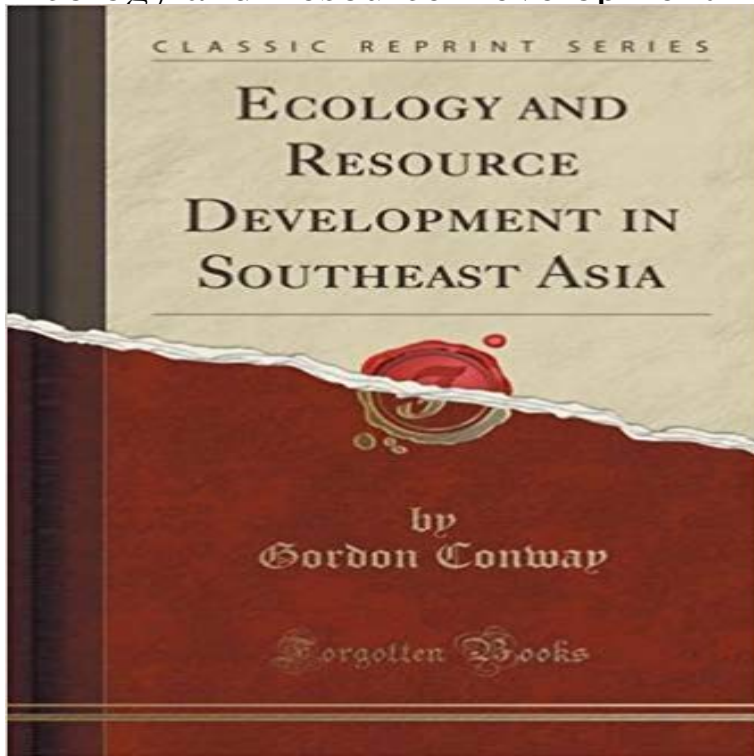

An ecosystem is any relatively self-contained system of organisms and their environment. Ecology is the study of ecosystems: their structure, functioning, and changes. Ecologists explore interactions between organisms and their environments. Any natural regime of soil, water, atmosphere, and light has some maximum amount of living material, or biomass, that it can support. If left undisturbed, biotic communities evolve toward successively more complex patterns of organization that increase the biomass. Those species better able to utilize site resources gradually replace those less efficient. Natural ecosystems can stabilize themselves in response to external disruptions.
