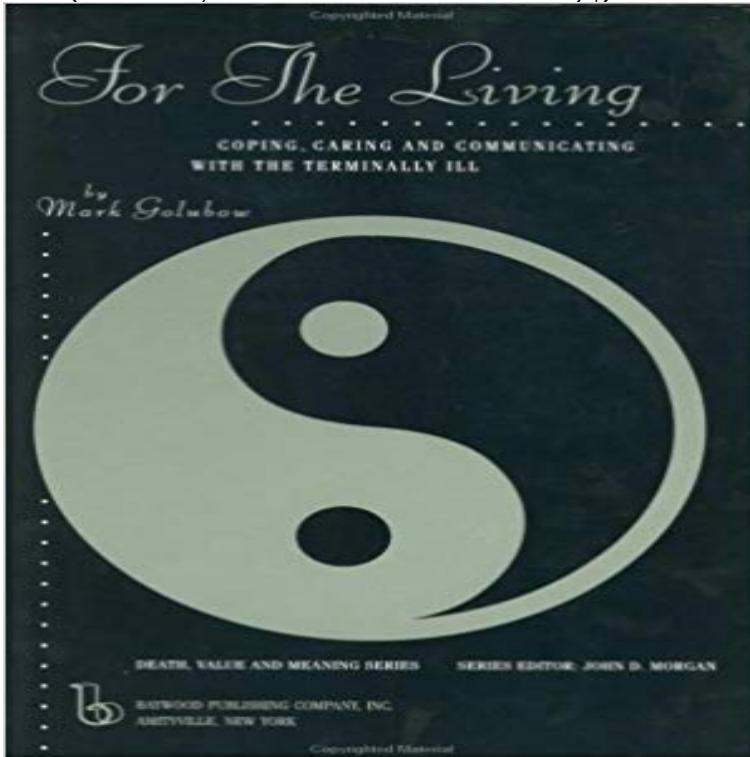


For the Living: Coping, Caring and Communicating With the Terminally Ill (Death, Value and Meaning)
