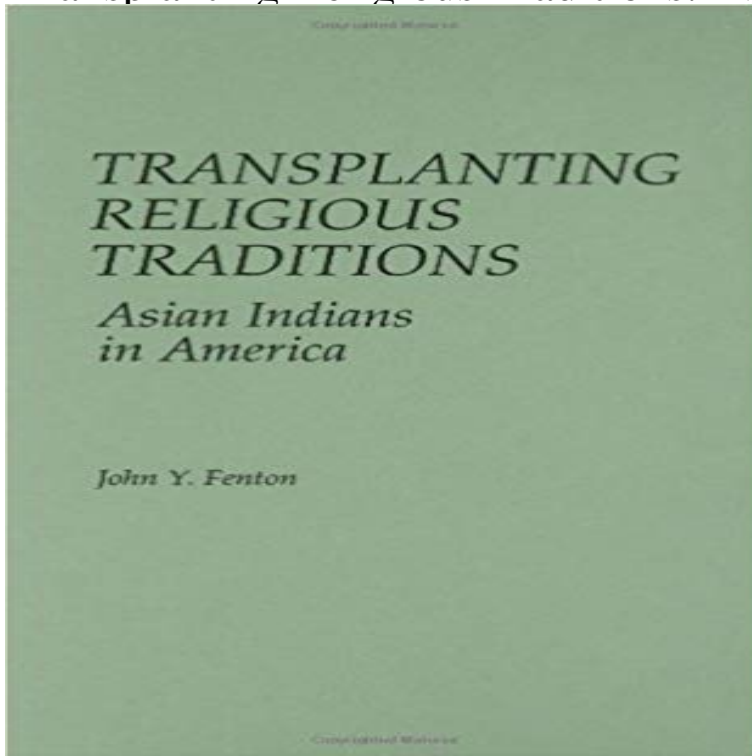


# Transplanting Religious Traditions: Asian Indians in America
